



Research on health inequalities using longitudinal demographic data

This advanced course in historical demography equips students with theories, sources and methods for analyzing inequalities in health. The course provides hands-on workshops in data management of longitudinal micro-level data, event-history analysis, and analysis of causes of death. It provides theoretical and methodological tools to analyze short-term economic stress using food prices and early-life exposures on health and mortality during the life course.

Structure: Theoretical lectures. Data management training using data from Sweden. Applied exercises. The course will be taught using STATA; access will be provided.

Prerequisites: Students are expected to be familiar with demographic and quantitative methods, historical micro-level data, and have at least intermediate level econometrics. Applicants should be enrolled in a PhD program, have recently received their PhD, or be enrolled in a MSc program.

How to apply: Application deadline is **1 April 2024**. Information of admittance will be sent on 30 April 2024. A maximum of 20 students will be admitted.

The course is organized by the European Society of Historical Demography and the Centre for Economic Demography (CED) at Lund University. There is a course fee of 150 EUR. Grants that cover (a part of) the travel and lodging and a limited number of fee waivers are available for students who need financial support. The course is organized under the auspices of ESHD and the COST-Action GREATLEAP (CA22116).
